



Frequently Asked Questions

RBC Capital Markets Scholarship for Women

Q: Who is eligible for the RBC Capital Markets Scholarship for Women?

- Canadian Citizen or permanent residents of Canada.
- Female students currently in their 2nd year of full-time undergraduate studies (at the time of application submission), enrolled in a business, engineering, or economics program at a accredited university in Canada
- Intending to continue their full-time undergraduate studies for their 3rd year.
- Minimum cumulative 3.5 GPA/80%, or equivalent, diverse extra-curricular participation, and community involvement.

Q: Are unofficial transcripts accepted during application submission?

Yes, we accept unofficial transcripts as part of your application submission.

Q: How many RBC Capital Markets Scholarships are available to be awarded?

There will be 4 scholarships available this year, in the amount of \$5,000 each.

Q: When is the final scholarship decision made?

Shortlisted applications will be invited to participate in a telephone or in-person interview in July at our Toronto office. All pre-approved travel expenses will be paid by RBC Capital Markets. Scholarship recipients will be announced at the end of the summer 2016.

Q: Can a recipient accept the Scholarship without the offer of employment for a Summer Analyst position at RBCCM?

This scholarship is unique as it's paired with the offer of employment to provide women the opportunity to get exposure to the Capital Markets business. Recipients must accept both the scholarship and offer of employment.

Q: When would eligible recipients receive their C\$5,000 scholarship?

Winners will receive their C\$5,000 scholarship once they complete their summer placements just before their fourth year of studies.

Q: I am a Quebec student and our programs are traditionally three years versus four. When am I eligible to apply?

Quebec students are eligible to apply in their first year of studies.

Q: For the Scholarship recipient who is awarded a summer placement in New York City, will their working permit be covered by RBC?

Yes, RBCCM will cover the work permit for the recipient who is offered a Summer position in the New York City office.
