



Grant set to boost wildlife in London's waterways

Royal Bank of Canada donation will improve freshwater habitats across the capital

LONDON, 22 March 2017 - Wildlife including fish, amphibians, birds and insects has received a welcome boost today on World Water Day thanks to a £51,000 grant from Royal Bank of Canada (RBC) that will directly fund a range of habitat improvements to waterways in the capital – including locations along the rivers Colne, Crane and Wandle.

London Wildlife Trust was chosen from among hundreds of applicants from around the world to receive a 2017 grant from the RBC Blue Water Project, a historic, wide-ranging, 10-year global commitment to help protect the world's most precious natural resource: fresh water.

Over the next year Trust staff and volunteers will make practical habitat improvements at five freshwater sites; create four community-owned and wildlife-friendly Sustainable Drainage Systems (SuDS) to soak up and store rainwater runoff; and will deliver a high-quality programme to train volunteers in surveying, monitoring and specialist practical conservation work. Water quality will also be carefully monitored and mapped across the city's waterways by a range of scientific means including wildlife surveys.

This important work will help to enrich urban waterways for people and nature, encouraging people to value the wildlife-rich streams and rivers that still flow across the capital, and will help to make London itself more resilient as rainfall fluctuates with hotter, drier summers and warmer, wetter winters.

Rosie Oldham, London Wildlife Trust grants manager, said: "We are delighted that on World Water Day we can get to work improving more of London's waterways for people and wildlife. Many thanks to Royal Bank of Canada for recognising the importance of this work with a generous grant of £51,000."
