



Real Clear Politics Poll Average - General Election 2020







#### Trump appears to be losing momentum among key voting blocs.







#### Trump's Handling of Coronavirus





- Just 22% say the U.S. has coronavirus completely or mostly under control, 78% say it is somewhat or not at all under control.
- Almost half of voters (48%) say they don't trust at all what President Trump says about the coronavirus, just 19% trust him a great deal.



#### Trump's Handling of the Economy






High Interest September/October of Election Year\*

#### What to Expect on Election Night

- More than 28 million early votes have already been cast (5x more than were cast early in 2016).
- In swing states with party registration (e.g. FI, NC, Pa), preliminary counts show returns from Democrats outnumber Republicans by about 2:1. (But that is short of some Democrats' goals.)
- Some key states (e.g. Wisconsin, Pennsylvania) do not start counting absentee ballots until Election Day.

#### As 2016 demonstrated, national polls are <u>not</u> determinative or predictive.

- State polls in key battleground states were scarce and often poor quality.
- Polls underestimated the turnout of white non-college-educated voters, especially in the Midwest.
- Undecided voters broke strongly for Trump in the final week of the campaign.
- The October surprise: The Comey letter
- There is an important difference between measuring and handicapping!
